



Adak Island Unguided Transported Caribou Hunt Agreement Motor Vessel North Pacific

Thank you for booking with Alaskan Adventure Tours. It is the goal of Alaskan Adventure Tours to make this trip the most enjoyable and memorable vacation you have ever experienced.

Alaskan Adventure Tours will provide client a Sunday to Sunday 8 day/7 nights unguided Caribou Hunt with meals and lodging included aboard the 100-foot Motor Vessel North Pacific. Definition of Unguided: No crew is legally allowed in the field with the hunter at any time. Alaskan Adventure Tours is not allowed to supply any hunting equipment to aid in the field or on the vessels. The price of this unguided caribou hunt is \$3,500.00 and includes the harvest of one caribou. An additional caribou may be hunted for a fee of \$500.00 regardless if the animal is harvested or not. Additional fee of \$500.00 must be paid in cash prior to the hunter entering the field to attempt to harvest a second caribou. Hunter must have valid tags and harvest tickets for additional caribou.

This unguided/transported trip will be conducted on Alaska Maritime National Wildlife Refuge Land. There is a daily land use fee of approximately \$6.00 for accessing the land. This fee is due at beginning of trip for the week.

Client agrees to arrive in Adak, Alaska on the Sunday of the beginning of their hunt date on Alaska Airlines from Anchorage. The flight will arrive at approximately 3:00 pm in Adak. Since it takes a few hours to load the vessel with all the gear and the clients with boat orientations and safety orientations the vessel will depart the Village of Adak early the next morning for the Southwest side of the island where the main caribou herd is prevalent. We will return to the village of Adak in time for you to make the scheduled flight on the following Sunday back to Anchorage. It is the sole discretion of the Captain on board as to when the vessel will depart the hunting grounds to return to Adak to make the Alaska Airlines Flight due to unpredictable weather conditions. Normally we leave for Adak the evening prior to the scheduled departure flight the next day. It is approximately a 5 hour boat ride each way from Adak to the hunting grounds.

For your convenience Alaskan Adventure Tours will have wet-lock boxes for sale in port while tied up to the dock for you to properly package your meat for the return flight. We cannot provide any items related to your hunt, once in the field.

It is the client's responsibility to arrive in the port of Adak with a non-resident or resident hunting license and all tags/tickets required and sportfishing license if desired. Sportfishing is complimentary and will be offered on an unguided basis only. If you wish to bring a fishing pole and fish on the salmon streams after you harvest your animal that is your option. This will not be considered a guided sportfishing trip in any way. The focus of the trip will be on hunting and offering all clients a harvest opportunity for Caribou. Client is responsible for all costs of licenses and tags associated with this trip.

Client is responsible for all taxidermy fees and game processing fees. Alaskan Adventure Tours is unable to assist in the field or provide any type of hunting services such as game processing, glassing, skinning, packing, etc...

Alaskan Adventure Tours, Inc. will not be responsible for the actions of any other company. This includes National Airline Carriers, Local Air Carriers, Alaskan Hotels, Taxi Companies, Shuttle/Bus Lines, Fish and Game Office, State Fish and Wildlife Department, US Fish and Wildlife, Alaska Big Game Guide Board, Taxidermists, Floatplane Services, etc...

A 50% non-refundable deposit was used to secure your trip date and the remaining balance is due by wire 30 days prior to your hunt date. If you choose to cancel your trip, your deposit is non-transferable to future years or other parties.

Wiring instructions are available upon request.

Alaskan Adventure Tours cannot control unpredictable Alaskan coastal weather conditions. Therefore, the company will not be responsible for any negative ramifications of adverse weather conditions during the hunt.

Further, even though Alaskan Adventure Tours, Inc. enjoys first class equipment and adheres to a rigorous maintenance schedule for all of its equipment, Alaskan Adventure Tours, Inc. will not be held liable for any negative ramifications resulting from unexpected and rare equipment failures and/or breakdowns. This policy parallels the operating policies of National Air Carriers and the Alaska Marine Highway Ferry System.

Even though Adak Island has one of the highest populations of Caribou per square mile in the State of Alaska, it is unlawful to guarantee that you will harvest an animal. You will not be hunting on a game ranch with high fences; this is a fair-chase hunt in the wilderness of Alaska. The definition of hunter success with Alaskan Adventure Tours is offering a first-class trip which includes top of the line equipment, accommodations and meal service. The definition of success also extends to the opportunity presented to the hunter to harvest an animal. What the hunter does with the opportunity becomes the hunters personal 'success rate'.

Client must be prepared to go into the field. The Caribou are not located on the beach. We recommend that you physically work out prior to the hunt and get yourself into moderate physical condition so that it will increase your ability to hunt effectively and pack out your Caribou meat and antlers. By Alaska Fish and Wildlife Regulations you are required to pack out all the edible meat from the field prior to bringing the antlers out.

It is the client's responsibility to leave with all meat harvested from Caribou, however you can donate meat to residents and local organizations with a transfer of meat form that is located in the back of the 2006-2007 Alaska Hunting Regulations included in your informational packet.

Client agrees to abide by all safety rules and regulations announced by Alaskan Adventure Tours at the beginning of each trip during the safety briefing. Client also agrees to abide by and respect all the vessel operational procedures. If you fail to abide by the vessel safety and operational requests your trip is subject to immediate termination as per United States Coast Guard Regulations.

Alaskan Adventure Tours will not tolerate in any way client boarding the vessel with any type of illegal drugs or drug paraphernalia. If found or suspected of drug use, it will be considered grounds for immediate trip termination as per United States Coast Guard Regulations.

As per Coast Guard Regulations we are not allowed to provide alcohol to clients on this trip. We do allow however clients to bring their own beer, wine or spirits. Excessive drinking is not permitted during the trip nor is consumption prior to or during hunting in the field.

Client agrees to disclose any serious health issues prior to the trip. This includes heart conditions, diabetes, allergies or any other condition that requires medication.

The wilds of Alaska wilderness can be treacherous and unpredictable. Hunting in the wilds of Alaska can increase your risk of injury. Alaskan Adventure Tours, Inc. enjoys a 100% safety success rating. However, Alaskan Adventure Tours will be held harmless in the event of accidental death or injury for duration of trip.

Note: We suggest purchasing trip insurance to assist in the unlikely event of trip delay, personal injury or medical evacuation. Trip Insurance information attached to informational packet. Also, Insurance information is now available through Safari Club International.

Alaskan Adventure Tours, Inc. is a family owned and operated business with high moral and ethical standards. Each year the Company experiences 'The Good, The Bad and The Ugly' in hunting client behavior. The company will not tolerate in any way verbal or physical abuse of staff or other clients during the trip. If this does occur the client's trip will be terminated immediately.
