



Icy Bay Mountain Goat Hunt Agreement Motor Vessel Alaskan Leader

Thank you for booking with Alaskan Adventure Tours. It is the goal of Alaskan Adventure Tours to make this trip the most enjoyable and memorable vacation you have ever experienced.

Alaskan Adventure Tours will provide client a 7 day/7 night trip with a guided 2x1 hunt, meals and lodging included at spike camp and aboard the 110-foot Motor Vessel Alaskan Leader. The price of this Mountain Goat Hunt is \$7,200.00 unless otherwise specified. There will be no trophy fee for the Goat hunt. This trip will consist of a minimum of 4 clients and a maximum of 6 hunting clients per trip. The non-hunter rate based on availability of space is \$1,400.00 per week.

Client agrees to arrive in Yakutat, Alaska on the morning or afternoon prior to the first day of the hunt. The client will meet up with a prearranged floatplane service and fly from the port of Yakutat to get to the vessels that will already be anchored up in Mountain Goat country in Icy Bay. The cost of the floatplane which is approximately a 15-20 minute flight will be divided by all hunting clients aboard the plane. If client misses scheduled shared floatplane, it is client's responsibility to charter floatplane to get to the vessels at clients expense. If client harvests an animal early it is clients option to fly out early by floatplane at client's expense. On the afternoon of the 7th day of the trip all clients will return to Yakutat by floatplane.

The State of Alaska requires three pieces of documentation to hunt Mountain Goats: Hunting License, Red Locking Tag and Goat Registration Permit. You can obtain the hunting license and red locking tag in advance either by mail or Internet if you like. The Registration permit must be obtained in person from Anchorage, Alaska Department of Fish and Game (907)267-2257.

It is the client's responsibility to arrive at the vessel which will be on anchor in remote Mountain Goat country with a non-resident hunting license, tag and registration permit in possession. You will not be allowed to hunt without a license, tag and registration permit. This will not be considered a guided sportfishing trip in any way. The focus of the trip will be on hunting and offering all clients a harvest opportunity. Client is responsible for all costs of licenses and tags associated with this trip.

Limited trophy care will be provided during the trip to include: the freezing of capes and/or meat. Client is responsible for all taxidermy fees.

It is client's responsibility to leave with all meat harvested from Mountain Goat. We will provide wet lock boxes for transportation of Mountain Goat meat and cape.

Alaskan Adventure Tours, Inc. will not be responsible for the actions of any other company, entity, groups or organizations. This includes National Airline Carriers, Local Air Carriers, Alaskan Hotels, Taxi Companies, Shuttle/Bus Lines, Fish and Game Office, State Fish and Wildlife Department, US Fish and Wildlife, Alaska Big Game Guide Board, Taxidermists, Floatplane Services, etc...

A 50% non-refundable deposit was used to secure your trip date and the remaining balance is due in United States Currency upon arriving in Yakutat. If you do not feel comfortable carrying cash, the balance must be wired to our account one week prior to your hunt date. If you choose to cancel your trip, your deposit is non-transferable to future years or other parties.

Wiring instructions are available upon request.

Before the hunt begins by law the Registered Guide will put you under contract. The contract will be a standard state issued guide/client contract. The Icy Bay Hunt will be supervised under Registered Guide Darren Byler License Number 1151. Darren Byler will also be physically present managing and guiding for the duration of the hunt. The hunt will be conducted entirely on State Land in Unit 6a, Southern Gulf Coast of Alaska. This area includes all beaches, tidal flats and uplands abutting the beaches. There is currently no land use fees associated with this hunt.

Alaskan Adventure Tours cannot control unpredictable Alaskan coastal weather conditions. Therefore, the company will not be responsible for any negative ramifications of adverse weather conditions during the hunt. Further, even though Alaskan Adventure Tours, Inc. enjoys first class equipment and adheres to a rigorous maintenance schedule for all of its equipment, Alaskan Adventure Tours, Inc. will not be held liable for any negative ramifications resulting from unexpected and rare equipment failures and/or breakdowns. This policy parallels the operating policies of National Air Carriers and the Alaska Marine Highway Ferry System.

Even though Icy Bay has a very healthy Mountain Goat population, it is unlawful to guarantee that you will harvest an animal. We will not be hunting on a game ranch with high fences; this is a fair-chase hunt in the wilderness of Alaska. The definition of hunter success with Alaskan Adventure Tours is offering a first-class trip which includes top of the line equipment, accommodations and meal service. The definition of success also extends to the opportunity presented to the hunter to harvest an animal. What the hunter does with the opportunity becomes the hunters personal 'success rate'.

Client will receive accommodations aboard the 110' M/V Alaskan Leader the evening before the hunt starts. The hunt will be conducted from spike camps at approximately 3,000-4,000 feet elevation. As previously discussed at sportsmen shows or during phone conversations, client fully understands that mountain goat hunting is physically demanding and that mountain goats reside at the upper elevations of mountains and not at the beach. Client also understands that he/she will be staying in a spike camp on the mountain, eating freeze dried food and sleeping in a tent camp Alaskan Adventure Tours strongly suggests that goat hunter's workout on a physical exercise regiment prior to the hunt. It will be the Guide's decision when it is safe and appropriate to leave the mountain with Client in the event Client tags out early.

Client agrees to abide by all safety rules and regulations announced by Alaskan Adventure Tours at the beginning of each trip during the safety briefing. Client also agrees to abide by and respect all the vessel operational procedures. If you fail to abide by the vessel safety and operational requests your trip is subject to immediate termination as per United States Coast Guard Regulations.

Alaskan Adventure Tours will not tolerate in any way client boarding the vessel with any type of illegal drugs or drug paraphernalia. If found or suspected of drug use, it will be considered grounds for immediate trip termination as per United States Coast Guard Regulations.

As per Coast Guard Regulations we are not allowed to provide alcohol to clients on this trip. We do allow however clients to bring their own beer, wine or spirits. Excessive drinking is not permitted during the trip nor is consumption prior to or during hunting in the field.

Client agrees to disclose any serious health issues prior to the trip. This includes heart conditions, diabetes, allergies or any other condition that requires medication.

The wilds of Alaska wilderness can be treacherous and unpredictable. Hunting dangerous game species increases your risk of injury. Alaskan Adventure Tours, Inc. and all guides associated with our Company enjoy a 100% safety success rating. However, Alaskan Adventure Tours will be held harmless in the event of accidental death or injury for duration of trip.

Note: We suggest purchasing trip insurance to assist in the unlikely event of trip delay, personal injury or medical evacuation. Trip Insurance information attached to informational packet. Also, Insurance information now available through Safari Club International.

Alaskan Adventure Tours, Inc. is a family owned and operated business with high moral and ethical standards. Each year the Company experiences 'The Good, The Bad and The Ugly' in hunting client behavior. The company will not tolerate in any way verbal or physical abuse of staff or other clients during the trip. If this does occur the client's trip will be terminated immediately.

Please sign that you have read and fully understand all of the details above. Client agrees to mail signed Hunt Agreement no later than 60 days prior to hunt or you will be considered a cancellation.
